

PROCEEDINGS OF BENNETT CITY COUNCIL - REGULAR

The regular meeting of the Bennett City Council was called to order by Mayor Sutton at 7:00 pm.

Council members present on roll call: Boedeker, Bentrott, Giebelstein, Schneekloth, Ehlers.

M/S, Giebelstein, Boedeker to approve Consent agenda including minutes, financial report & bills.

Citizens: Darlene Ballenger & Gary Grage presented Council with a Memorial for new landscaping in front of City Hall. Council thanked them for the generous donations.

Citizens: Janet Shotwell voiced concerns over utility billing and city clerk will look into adding a date of billing to current invoices. Bills will be due 15 days from billing date.

Library: Book Camp was a success with 35 kids attending.

Fire department: Drill training, storm watch & county meeting in September. Ham dinner went over very well serving over 800 people.

Ambulance report: 6 calls. County will not be switching over to P25 radios at this time.

Administration report : Looking into attending budget meeting in November.

Sheriff's Report : 5 calls.

Parks: Working on getting lines painted on the basketball court.

New Business:
